Eileen Flanagan has been leading workshops on spirituality and social justice for nearly twenty-five years. As a leader of Earth Quaker Action Team, she helped craft and implement the strategy that pushed a \$4-billion-a-year bank to withdraw from financing mountaintop removal coal mining. She is also the author of three books, most recently *Renewable: One Woman's Search for Simplicity, Faithfulness, and Hope,* which tells the story of the midlife spiritual crisis that led her to climate justice activism. It recently won a Silver Nautilus Book Award and was a finalist in the Next Generation Indie Book Awards.
