



Jonathan also researches collective action, identity, and politicization processes as the focus of his doctoral work in the sociology department at UC Berkeley. His writing has appeared in *The Nation*, *The Huffington Post*, *Alternet*, *Waging Nonviolence*, *Yes Magazine*, *The Sociological Quarterly*, *Berkeley Journal of Sociology*. *Hegemony How-To: A Roadmap for Radicals* was released this January to critical acclaim.
