


Matthew, Mark, Luke, and Us: Gospel and Community

A short course with Doug Gwyn and Francisco Burgos

The New Testament gospels associated with the names Matthew, Mark, and Luke were probably the work of whole communities of first-century Christians. Over the course of decades, they remembered the life and teachings of Jesus, and prophesied in his Spirit, to create the story we inherit today. As a twenty-first-century community, we will listen together to the teachings and stories of Jesus, seeking our own answers to his question, "Who do you say that I am?"

Francisco Burgos will add further perspective from the community-centered Bible study methods of the liberation theology movement in Latin America. In addition, we will listen to some classic Quaker texts to bridge between the ancient text and our own experience. Participants may wish to bring their preferred translation of the Bible.

Doug Gwyn is a minister and author among Friends. Formerly the Quaker Studies teacher at Pendle Hill, A well-traveled Friend, Doug has worked for the American Friends Service Committee, served among Friends as a pastor, and taught at Woodbrooke Quaker Study Centre (UK), as well as Pendle Hill. Doug is a student of the Bible and of early Quakerism. His most recent books are *The Anti-War: Militant Peacemaking in the Manner of Friends* (2016) and *The Call to Radical Faithfulness: Covenant in Quaker Experience* (2017).

Francisco Burgos is currently the director of education at Pendle Hill. He has facilitated spiritual retreats and *lectio divina* sessions for many different audiences. A De La Salle Christian Brother for almost ten years, serving in the Dominican Republic, Guatemala, and Costa Rica, Francisco has been a Friend since 2004 and is a member of Harrisburg Friends Meeting (PA). He also served as Head of School at Monteverde Friends School.
