

Help Pendle Hill Craft a “Friendly Forest” with Your Children’s Community Tree Art!

Dear Friends’ School Art Teachers and Monthly Meeting First Day School Teachers:

Pendle Hill is excited to announce a call for submissions from K-6 grade artists for group projects on the theme of *Community Trees*. Similar in concept to the family tree, we invite you to create together a tree that represents your school or meeting community. We will exhibit the community tree projects in our Tree Rooms Gallery in Main House and create a “Friendly Forest.”

Requirements:

- **K-6 Grades** – Please note: while our hope is that these projects will be created by Kindergarten and elementary age artists, we recognize that some First Day School’s communities consist of some slightly older children, who of course are welcome to participate as well.
- **Structural Details** – We are seeking 2-dimensional pieces that can hang on one or more hooks. To aid us in hanging the projects, please ensure that there is some rigidity to the structure.
- **Maximum Dimensions** – 30”x30”x1.5”
- **Number of Projects** – Our hope is to include art from many different Friends’ communities in this exhibit. If you hope to submit more than one piece per school/meeting, please contact Jesse White for approval **PRIOR** to creating your projects.

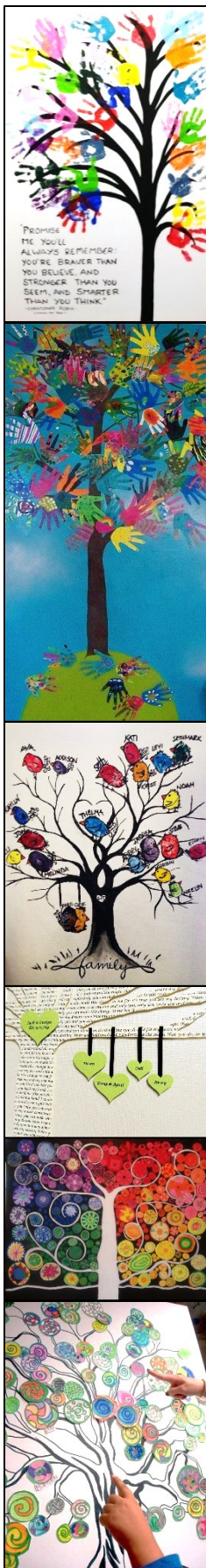
Submissions:

Please submit high resolution (at least 300 dpi) images of the front and back of your project to jwhite@pendlehill.org by March 1, 2019. Please attach the images to an email that includes:

- Title of your Community Tree
- Names of Artists, and Teacher(s)
- Final Size
- Any special notes about hanging, delivery or pickup of the work

Important Dates:

- **March 1** final deadline for emailing high resolution images of your group’s project and list of details (see above)
- **March 28** the date by which you will receive confirmation of your piece in the exhibit, and an artists’ representative agreement form for teachers to sign and return
- **April 11** deadline to return all agreement forms
- **May 11, 9-11am** drop off work to Main House
- **May 12, 2-4pm** Art reception with time for sharing with the group by one or two representative artists for each community tree. *Free! All are welcome!*
- **September 5, 1:30-3:30pm** collect work.
