Mid-summer can bring a wide range of insect species including butterflies and dragonflies into focus alongside maturing perennials in the meadows and specialist bees in the garden. Mosses, ferns and lichens add additional layers of diversity to what might be seen and explored. We will also show how iNaturalist can help to add observational records to biodiversity inventorying in the area.
